Help us “Make a Splash” at Texas Drive Park



The Parks & Trails Committee is excited to announce the launch of the “Make a Splash” campaign, which is raising funds for a community splash pad at Texas Drive Park. The proposed splash pad would be approximately 2,000 SqFt in size and include 15-20 spray/water features. The structure would be separated into three zones: toddler, young child, and a family-friendly area.

The splash pad is part of the Township’s long-term vision for Texas Drive Park and a key component of the Parks & Trails Master Plan.

“A splash pad is a destination amenity. Not only would this offer a safe and enriching place for families to connect, but would also bring visitors into our community. With the close proximity of the park to our downtown core, we anticipate the splash pad to be an economic driver for our local businesses.” - Superintendent Julie VanderWiere

The fundraising goal for the project is \$400,000. The Township Board has committed to funding \$100,000-\$150,000 of the \$541,000 project cost. The Township has partnered with Texas Township Friends of Parks & Trails to raise funding for the project. We want everyone to have the opportunity to participate in the development of this exciting project. Donations of any amount are welcome and appreciated, but some structured donor levels have been established with

options for corporate donors to receive varying levels of recognition. All contributions are tax-deductible and will be utilized for the construction or maintenance of the splash pad.

Annual maintenance has been a factor in the decision-making process. Through the installation of a well, maintenance costs can be minimized. The Township anticipates an annual budget of \$5,000 for maintenance, with additional monies set aside for future repairs of the spray features.

Short-Term Flooding Mitigation Project Comes to a Successful Close

In 2018, Texas Township collaborated with State and Local representatives, neighboring communities, Prein and Newhof Engineering, Kalamazoo County Drain Commission, Kalamazoo County Road Commission, Lake and Neighborhood Associations, as well as up and downstream property owners to develop a plan to mitigate the historic flooding. A Flood Task Force was created and a short-term flood mitigation project was implemented. After two years of pumping, the drawdown for both Eagle and Crooked Lakes measured 42.48 inches. Crooked Lake successfully met their permit target level and Eagle Lake was only 6.72 inches from their permit target level.

This pumping project successfully helped to relieve flooding for hundreds of impacted homes and was an incredible example of a successful public private partnership project. As we move forward with the long-term project, we would be remiss not to thank the many people that provided easements to enable the short-term project. The success of this project would have been impossible without the generosity of these property owners:

We look forward to working with the Kalamazoo County Drain Office to implement the long-term project that will safeguard these lakes from experiencing historic flooding in the future.

Electronics Recycling Event Piloted This August

We'll be collecting items such as old monitors, TVs, computers, and various electronic devices. Some fees do apply for disposal of the following larger items CRT Monitors (\$10) and CRT TVs (\$20).

Township Hall Project Update

The Township Board continues to work on determining the best location for a new Township Hall facility. Thank you to all 1,126 individuals who responded to the Township Hall Project Community Survey. Based on the feedback received and comments provided in writing and at various meetings, the Township Board has moved forward with the solicitation of an RFP for land acquisition within the Corners Business District (Texas Corners). Proposals and previously considered sites will be reviewed and evaluated by the members of the Township Board, staff, and by representatives from Progressive AE, the design firm for the project. We anticipate that the review will be completed during the month of July and decisions could be made in August. Vegetation and Noxious Weeds Ordinance Under Consideration

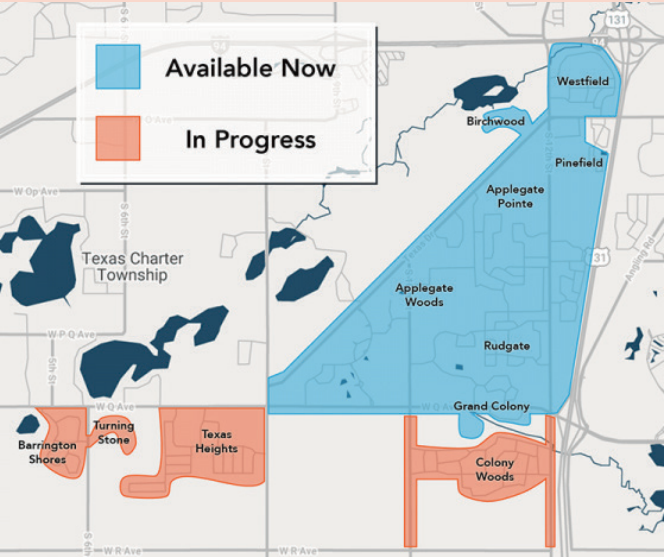
The Township Board is currently considering the adoption of a new ordinance that would require property owners to:

1. Destroy all noxious weeds found on their land (noxious weeds are defined by Public Act 359 of 1941).
2. Cut and remove uncontrolled plant growth or uncultivated vegetation three feet from either the edge of road pavement or back of sidewalk, so vegetation does not impede visual clearance of roadways.
3. Maintain lawn areas below a height of eight inches.
4. Manage duff and yard waste, particularly during the fall season (October through December), to minimizes impacts, such as transference of leaves to neighboring properties or the attraction of pests.

The goal of the ordinance is to protect public health and safety through the removal of noxious and nuisance vegetation; maintain and enhance property values; improve and preserve the aesthetic appearance of residential neighborhoods, commercial properties, and Township streetscapes; and promote the protection of native vegetation. If adopted, the new ordinance would likely go into effect by the end of July. Please check the Township website for more information on the draft ordinance.

CTS Fiber Installation Underway

CTS is currently installing fiber internet in the Colony Woods neighborhood. Please note that final yard restoration won't be completed until the end of the neighborhood installation, but they will be taking steps to start yard restoration throughout the project. ARPA Funding Update

Based on information released from the State, the Township is estimated to receive \$1.8M in funding from the American Rescue Plan Act. Staff are working through the details on when and how these funds will be distributed and what are considered qualifying uses. Further details will be announced soon.

Provide Input on What You Would Like to See in Texas Corners

The Township Planning Commission is beginning work on updates to the Corners Business District zoning ordinance, which encompasses the Texas Corners area. The intent is to develop regulations that will assist with the vision established for Texas Corners in the Texas Township Master Plan. To help in that regard, a Visual Preference Survey is under development. The survey, which collects feedback on items like preferred building size, color, setback, architectural style, and more, will be accessible between August 1st and August 31st.

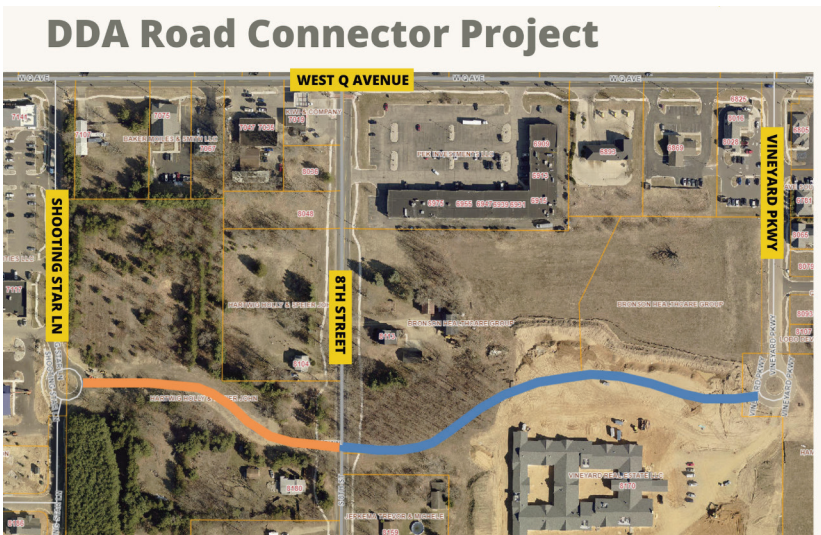

Design Work on Ring Road Project Begins

The DDA recently contracted with VK Civil Engineering for the design of a segment of the “Ring Road” connecting Vineyard Parkway to 8th Street, and 8th Street to Shooting Star Lane. The development of this roadway will help reduce traffic on West Q Avenue and improve connectivity in Texas Corners.

The DDA and VK Civil are working with adjacent property owners, the Road Commission of Kalamazoo County, and representatives of the Township throughout the design phase, which is in the preliminary stages. Once the design work is finalized, the DDA and the Township Board can determine the project cost for construction and evaluate potential funding sources.



New Strategic Plan Adopted

On May 24, 2021, the Township Board adopted a new Strategic Plan. The plan provides a vision and framework for where the Board would like to direct financial and human resources over the next five years. The plan is structured into three goal areas, with defined objectives and tasks to support each goal area. Future budgets, capital improvement projects, and initiatives will be considered and funded based on their alignment with this plan.

- **Goal Area 1: Connected Community**
- **Goal Area 2: Balanced Development**
- **Goal Area 3: Optimized Systems & Infrastructure**

Annually, the Township Board and staff will conduct a comprehensive review of the plan to identify tasks for the following year with monthly and periodic reviews.

Annual Parcel Review

The State of Michigan requires the Assessing Department to review 20% of parcels each year. This review includes measuring buildings and taking photos. The Assessing Department (comprised of a few new faces) will be conducting this review over the next several months. You will receive a postcard mailer prior to their review. Cars will be marked and staff will have township ID with them. If you have questions or concerns, please contact the Assessing Department.

Summer Taxes Due Tuesday, September 14

Your 2021 Summer property tax bill is due in the Township office no later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 14th. Any payment placed in our Drop Box (located on the west side of the Township Hall Parking Lot) by 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday, September 15 will be recognized as an “on-time” payment. Late payments will incur 1% interest each month.

OPTION #1: USPS Mail - Mail your payment to Texas Township Treasurer, 7110 W Q Ave, Kalamazoo, MI 49009. Please include your payment and the bottom portion of your tax statement. If you would like a receipt, please provide an email address or a self-addressed, stamped envelope. Postmarks are not accepted. In all late-payment disputes, the Texas Township Treasurer’s Office will rely on the receipt stamp applied by Township administrative staff.

OPTION #2: CREDIT CARD Visit texastownship.org and click on the pay online now tab to pay with a debit or credit card. A processing fee of 3% is charged by the online vendor (Point & Pay). Select E-Check and the online vendor fee is \$3.00.

OPTION #3: ONLINE BANKING

Check with your financial institution to inquire about online bill pay. Please allow **1-2 weeks** for receipt of your payment by the Texas Township Treasurer’s Office.

OPTION #4: DROP BOX

A 24-hour secure drop box is located at the west end of the township hall parking lot. Please include your payment and the bottom portion of your tax statement. If you would like a receipt, please provide an email address or a self-addressed, stamped envelope.

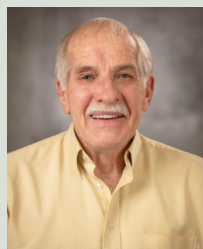
