



Township Encouraging Motorists and Bicyclists to “Share the Road”

On June 26, 2017, the Texas Township Board passed a resolution supporting the “Share the Road” initiative in response to the increasing growth of the cycling community in Texas Township. The Township Board is committed to providing safe roads for bicyclists and motorists alike and encourages all users of the road, whether they be motorists, bicyclists, or pedestrians, to practice safety, use extreme caution and obey all Michigan traffic laws.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration encourages all road users, including motorists and bicyclists, to respect each other and foster a safer transportation environment. Bicyclists on the roadway have the same rights, and responsibilities as motorized vehicles.

Safety Tips for Bicyclists:

- Always ride with traffic and follow the rules of the road.
- Do not ride more than two abreast.
- Ride on the trail, paved shoulder, bike lane, or bike route.
- Make it easy for drivers to see you by dressing in bright colors and wearing reflective material both in front and back.
- Equip your bicycle with appropriate lights and reflectors.
- Wear appropriate high visibility safety gear, including helmet.
- Watch for turning traffic.
- Use appropriate hand signals when turning or slowing down.
- Watch for debris that might cause you to fall or swerve.

- Whereas, The Charter Township of Texas Board of Trustees recognize the bicycle is a viable and environmentally sound form of transportation and an excellent form of recreation; and

- Whereas, Texas Township road and trail system attracts hundreds of bicyclists each year from Southwest Michigan, providing economic, health, and scenic benefits to citizens of Michigan; and
- Whereas, These bicycling activities and attractions have great potential to have a positive impact on Texas Township’s economy and to stimulate economic development by making the township attractive to businesses and citizens who enjoy the out of doors and healthy lifestyles; and
- Whereas, The demand for alternative modes of transportation has been growing dramatically over the last few years; and
- Whereas, Creating bicycle-friendly communities has been shown to improve citizens’ health, well-being, and quality of life, to boost community spirit, to improve traffic safety, and to reduce pollution and congestion; and
- Whereas, The education of bicyclists and motorists as to the proper and safe operation of bicycles is important to ensure the safety and comfort of all users; and
- Whereas, Education of bicyclists and motorists will contribute to the safety of all, while equipping more citizens with the skills and confidence to use bicycles for commuting, exercising, recreation, and transportation;

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the members of the Charter Township of Texas Board of Trustees support the Share the Road initiative and the increased effort to educate all motorized and non-motorized users on how to safely share our roads in Texas Township.

Downtown Development Authority Launches New "Corners Coins" Promotion

The Texas Township DDA has developed a shopper incentive program called "Corners Coins" to help bring residents and visitors into Texas Corners to patronize area businesses. Corners Coins are 2" wooden tokens, worth \$5 each, and can be spent just like cash at any participating business or the Texas Township Farmers' Market.

These Coins will first be introduced at this year's LOL5K on Saturday, August 12. Each participant in the LOL5k will receive a \$5 Corners Coin, funded by the DDA, along with a map of the participating Texas Corners businesses and information regarding where and how Coins can be spent. Participating businesses will receive signage to display so patrons can easily identify if they are participating in the program.

Important Summer Property Tax Info

SUMMER 2017 PROPERTY TAX BILLS – DUE JULY 1ST THROUGH SEPTEMBER 14TH

Your 2017 Summer Tax bills were recently mailed and are due and payable no later than September 14, 2017. In Texas Township the Summer Tax Bill contains billing for the State Education Tax (6.0000 mills) and County Operating (4.6810 mills). The amount you owe is tied to your taxable value which is established each year by the Township Assessor as of December 31 of the previous year.

PRINCIPAL RESIDENCE EXEMPTION (PRE)

If you have not already done so, please file your Principal Residence Exemption (PRE) no later than November 1st. The Principal Residence Exemption (PRE) exempts a principal residence from the tax levied by a local school district for operating purposes, up to 18 mills. Principal residence means the dwelling that you own and occupy as your permanent home and any unoccupied adjoining or contiguous properties that are classified residential. Occupying means this is your principal residence, the place that you reside in as your permanent residence, and if absent intend to return. It should be the address that appears on your driver's license and voter registration card. Vacation homes, season homes, and income property are not occupied as your principal residence and may not be claimed.

APPLICATION FOR DEFERMENT OF SUMMER 2017 TAXES

We are currently accepting applications for Summer 2017 tax deferments. The applicant must be 62 years of age or older or paraplegic, quadriplegic, eligible serviceperson, veteran, widow or widower, blind, or totally and permanently disabled. Under MCL 211.51 PROPERTY TAXES MAY BE DEFERRED UNTIL FEBRUARY 14, 2018, without penalty or interest, the due date of summer property taxes on their principal residence. To qualify, a household income cannot exceed \$40,000. Those that farm agricultural real property may also qualify. The deferment form must be completed and filed by September 14, 2017. On February 15, 2018 additional penalties and interest will apply.

Knox Box Recommendation

When a medical emergency strikes, help is only a call away. however, for those who live by themselves or who have special mobility issues, what happens when they can’t get to the door to let help in?

Knox-Box Rapid Entry System is a secure emergency access program developed for property owners and first responders. If a fire breaks out or there is a medical emergency, Knox Box products allow immediate entry into buildings and property without forced entry damage or delay. Property owners store entrance keys, access cards and floor plans in high-security Knox Box key boxes mounted near building and home entrances. Each Knox Box purchased by a property owner is keyed to a single master key, controlled by the Texas Township Fire Department.

While Knox Boxes are not required for residential developments, the Fire Department encourages all homeowners to consider investing in a Knox Box. For more information, please contact Fire Chief Chad Tackett at 269.375.4610.

Site Preparation To Begin at 6th St. Park

Texas Township has approved funds to begin working towards the future development of a new park at 6321 S. 6th Street. As you may recall, in 2015 the Texas Township Board approved the conceptual designs of a new 6th Street Park and a redesigned Texas Drive Park. Earlier this year, Texas Township applied for an MDNR grant, which, if awarded, would provide \$150,000 of grant funding for the first phase of construction for the 6th Street Park.

In order to prepare the site for future development once grant funding has been secured, the Township Board has approved the following site preparation projects, which will be completed yet this year.

- **Removal and relocation of utility lines**
- **Removal of the berm located at site entrance**
- **Seeding of grass and clearing of trees**
- **Installation of a split-rail fence & temporary sign**

We are excited to take this first step towards the development of the new 6th Street Park and look forward to the continued expansion of Texas Township’s parks and trails systems.
